Thank you for your interest in the Oregon Child Forensic Interview Training (OCFIT). Below are important notes about the application process:

- OCFIT is a 6 day online training that focuses on conducting Child Forensic Interviews in a Children's Advocacy Center (CAC). You are responsible for understanding your MDT protocol regarding child interviewing in your region.
- OCFIT is packed with content that builds over the course of the training, culminating in practice interviews and a post-test. Applicants should be prepared to be attentive with their cameras on for the duration of the training.
- This document is an application, not an enrollment form. Those who will conduct child forensic interviews in a CAC receive priority enrollment.
- Acceptance/waitlist status is shared 3 weeks before the training start date.
- Applications are reviewed and prioritized by Oregon Child Abuse Solutions, Regional Children's Advocacy Centers, and the Oregon Department of Justice, based on regional training needs, position, and agency representation.

TRAINING DETAILS

If accepted, you will be notified by end-of-day 3 weeks before training start date. OCFIT is a 6 day online training, spread across three weeks. The schedule is below:

You are expected to both read the pre-requisite reading material and complete the pretest before the training start date. The training will not be recorded and must be attended live. You are expected to attend this training in its entirety. Missing 30 minutes or more of training will prohibit you from receiving a certificate of completion, and you will not be eligible for any reimbursement of expenses related to the training from DOJ. You will receive a certificate for 32 hours of training upon successful completion of the training.

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Where do you interview and what kind(s) of interviewing do you do?

This information is used to prioritize your application. For purposes of this training, interview types are defined as follows:

An initial responder interview is a minimal-facts interview conducted in the field by initial responders such as law enforcement officers and/or Department of Human Services Child Welfare Personnel. These interviews elicit just enough information to establish safety and determine the need for a criminal investigation and/or an immediate medical evaluation. This interview typically takes place during the initial responder's first contact with the child/family and may be followed by an in-depth forensic interview.

A forensic interview is a developmentally sensitive and legally sound structured conversation with a child intended to elicit detailed information about a possible event(s) that the child may have experienced or witnessed. Forensic interviews are coordinated to avoid duplicative interviewing, follow research-based guidelines, and are conducted by trained professionals who participate in ongoing peer review, ideally in a child-friendly environment, such as a CAC.
